REDESIGNATION ORDER NO. 00-09.01-01A
TO THE DEPUTY MANAGER OF THE
IDAHO CLEANUP PROJECT

1. REDESIGNATION. Pursuant to the authority vested in me as Assistant Secretary under Redesignation Order 00-09-XX, I hereby redesignate the Deputy Manager of the Idaho Cleanup Project ("the Deputy Manager") as my authorized representative to perform on my behalf as the Secretary's "authorized representative," as that term is used in the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) regulations at 10 CFR 72.16(b) (entitled "Oath or affirmation"), and as named holder of the NRC licenses SNM-2504, SNM-2508, and SNM-2512. The Deputy Manager is designated as the Secretary's authorized representative to take such action as is necessary and appropriate to perform the duties and responsibilities of his or her position, including, but not limited to, any responsibilities assigned by Departmental policies, standards, programs, organization and budgetary limitations, and prescribed administrative instructions. The Deputy Manager shall coordinate NRC licensing actions that could amend the license and ensure that any such actions are concurred in by the Office of the General Counsel and the Office of Environmental Management.
2. RECISSION. Redesignation Order No. 00-09.01-01 is hereby rescinded.
3. LIMITATION.
 - a. Pursuant to this redesignation, the Deputy Manager shall be governed by the rules and regulations of DOE or the NRC (per 3.b below), and the policies and procedures prescribed by the Secretary of Energy or the Commissioners of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (per 3.b below), or his or her delegates.
 - b. The NRC is recognized as the legal regulatory authority with respect to the possession and management of materials under the subject licenses. Therefore, the NRC requirements that are within NRC's jurisdiction under section 202 of the Energy Reorganization Act of 1974 will apply to the licensing, design, construction, operations, and decommissioning of any facility subject to those licenses. DOE orders, regulations, and/or guidelines will apply where the NRC defers to DOE or does not exercise regulatory authority, or where the NRC does not have jurisdiction under section 202 of the Energy Reorganization Act of 1974.
 - c. The Office of the General Counsel must concur in filings and responses to NRC concerning potential enforcement actions, requests to amend, renew or terminate a license and applications for a new NRC license.
 - d. Nothing in this order shall preclude the Secretary, the Under Secretary, or Assistant Secretary from exercising any of their authority whenever in their judgment the exercise of such authority is necessary or appropriate to administer the functions vested in them.
4. AUTHORITY TO REDESIGNATE. This designation may not be redesignated or delegated.

5. DURATION AND EFFECTIVE DATE.

- a. This redesignation shall remain in full force and effect unless or until rescinded, amended, or superseded.
- b. Any amendments to this redesignation shall be in consultation with the Office of the General Counsel.
- c. A copy of this Order shall be provided to the Office of Management.
- d. This redesignation will become effective once the NRC approves license amendments to SNM-2504, SNM-2508, and SNM-2512. These amendments will identify the changes made to the designation.
